#### **SECTION 4: First Aid Measures**

**Eye contact :** flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. If irritation occurs, seek medical attention.

### **SECTION 5 : Firefighting Measures**

Suitable extinguishing media: Use water fog, foam, dry chemical or carbon dioxide (CO2).

**Inappropriate extinguishing media:** Straight streams of water.
